


The path to a community garden

How to start a community garden in your neighbourhood



1

Read the [Community Gardens Policy](#)

3

Look for a [location\(s\)](#) in your neighbourhood that fits the policy guidelines

4

Form a Community Garden Group! Talk to your neighbours, residents adjacent to proposed location and others who might be interested

5

Contact your local [Community Association \(CA\)](#) to determine if they support the idea

6

Find a [non-profit organization to manage and operate the garden](#) (CA, Zone Board, or other)

7

Create and send your garden proposal to gardens@regina.ca

8

Review of the garden proposal by [City Community Consultant](#)

9

Meet with [City Staff](#) to refine the proposal. If not suitable, City Staff will help the group determine a more suitable location

10

Preliminary approval and formal [City review](#)

11

Lead the community consultation with support from [City Staff](#)

12

Community approval

Report to Council

14

[Lease agreement](#) signed by the City and the non-profit

15

[Garden construction](#) organized by, managed by, and paid for by the non-profit organization

*Community gardens throughout Regina are operated by non-profit organizations. These steps typically take a minimum of one year to 16 months to accomplish for each site.
