









## Highest Certificate, Diploma Or Degree For The Population Aged 15 Years And Over In Private Households




# Population Aged 15 Years And Over By Labour Force Status








### Household Total Income Groups In 2020 For Private Households (Pre & Post Tax)




### Population, By Age Group, With After Tax Income Below The Low Income Measure








### Population By Immigration Catagory

### Immigrant Population By Year Of Immigration







